







Dear Partners of Slovenian tourism,

Slovenia has become well-recognised globally as an excellent destination for active experiences in pristine nature and for pampering in numerous health resorts, where thermal water has beneficial effects on the body and mind. It is also a destination where various congresses and meetings can be held, or for organising challenging sports events and preparations for sportspeople, due to the combination of natural features, suitable infrastructure and qualified staff. In 2018, for example, we held, among other things, the *International Golf Travel Market (IGTM)*, the Tour of Slovenia and the *I FEEL SLOVENIA IRONMAN 70.3 Slovenian Istria*. All of these events were particularly well-attended, and received a positive

response from the expert public and in the global media, where Slovenia's placing among the seven safest countries in the world for travel on the travel risk map for 2019 prepared by the international organisations International SOS and Control Risk also received a lot of attention.

Due to the diverse, high-quality and boutique offer of Slovenian tourism, which places uniqueness and individuality in the foreground, Slovenia is also gradually becoming recognised in other fields. Lonely Planet, the leading travel guide publisher, described it as a country with top restaurants and wine shops and of undiscovered small towns. In less than a year, it placed Slovenia on as many as three lists of destinations worth visiting: the Julian Alps were placed among the top ten destinations of the Lonely Planet's Best in Travel 2018, the Vipava Valley was placed among the Lonely Planet's Best in Europe 2018 Top 10 Destinations and Slovenia as a whole was listed among the Lonely Planet's Best in Travel Top 10 Best Value Destinations to Visit in 2019.

Virtuoso, the world's leading luxury travel network, published a photo of Lake Bled on the cover of its prestigious *Virtuoso Traveler* magazine, and ranked Slovenia on the list of the top 18 destinations to visit in 2018. Alongside the tourism organisations of Australia, Mexico, New Zealand and Switzerland, the Slovenian Tourist Board was among Virtuoso's nominees for the best tourism organisation of 2018. We were truly honoured to be able to showcase the offer of Slovenian tourism at Virtuoso's annual Chairman's Event in Venice, which was attended by selected parties, i.e. Virtuoso's most important and successful members.

In 2018, Slovenia received the title of the European Region of Gastronomy 2021, after a complex candidature. The internationally acclaimed gastronomy guide Gault&Millau was also published in Slovenian for the first time, highlighting as many as 130 restaurants, 50 popular places, 50 top wineries and 15 craft breweries. Some 31 restaurants received exceptionally high scores: six received four toques and 25 restaurants received three, which proves that our country is successfully on its way to becoming a destination for supreme gastronomy experiences, which match perfectly with its wide and diverse selection of high-quality cultural events and the offer of rich cultural heritage.

Slovenian tourism brings together people who strive for exceptional, innovative, boutique and sustainability-oriented experiences. Our objective is to offer 5-star experiences which attract demanding guests in higher income brackets throughout the year, and whose wish to enjoy diverse and active experiences come true in Slovenia, and bring them peace and personal benefits, and result in new discoveries about themselves and others.

Dear Partners, you have also contributed to the success of Slovenian tourism. I hope that you continue to recognise Slovenia as a destination worth recommending to your favourite clients. New online training courses are being prepared for you which are based on modern digital technologies and include a process of gamification. The training will enable you to enhance your knowledge of Slovenia – which we already regularly inform you about through Trade News, LinkedIn and Twitter – in an interesting and fun way. RIODIVERSITY


Slovenia's biodiversity has been exceptionally well preserved (through the Natura 2000 Network and other protected areas, such as national, regional and landscape parks). Of all the European Union Member States, Slovenia boasts the largest share of Natura 2000 sites, as 37% of its territory is covered by Natura 2000. One tenth of Slovenia's territory is protected under nature conservation laws.

FORESTS

Forests make up the most characteristic type of ecosystem in Slovenia, the country's greatest natural treasure. Forests provide us with an identity and are our promise of a future and an improved quality of life.

Three-fifths of Slovenian territory is covered by forests. Slovenia is the third most forested country in Europe after Finland and Sweden. For comparison, the world average of forest cover is about 30 percent and in Europe about 40 percent.

In Slovenia, forests are synonymous with a high quality of life, with recreational leisure activities which are extremely appreciated, and with a place of relaxation. An increasing number of Slovenians are seeking a quiet moment in the woods and spending their free time hiking, biking and engaging in other recreational activities.



WATER

The only European country combining the Alps, the Adriatic Sea, the Karst and the Pannonian Plain at manageable distances excites with its thermal and mineral springs, waves of the sea, picturesque lakes, diverse rivers and intermittent watercourses, which create unusual landscapes below the earth's surface and also provide good drinking water, which can be enjoyed directly from the tap.

The watercourse network is over 26,000 kilometres long. There are over 200 natural and artificial lakes and around 7500 water springs in Slovenia. Thermal and mineral springs in 15 registered natural health resorts enhance health and well-being. Slovenia's

glacial lakes such as Lake Bled and Lake Bohinj are an ideal starting point for walks along mountain streams.

UNDERGROUND WORLD

Slovenia is a karstic land, and it was the Slovenian Karst that lent its name to karst landscapes and phenomena across the world, for it was here that scientists first explained numerous karst features. Speleologists discover new caves in Slovenia every year, which amount to more than 11.000 by now, but only about 20 of them are show caves. The largest and most visited is Postojna Cave, the home of the human fish.

In 2018, Postojna Cave celebrated two hundred years of guided tours. The cave first "opened its doors" to the public in April 1818.

Since then, the cave's unbelievable forms have been viewed by more than 38 million visitors from all over the world.

FLORA AND FAUNA

Slovenia accounts for less than 0.004% of the Earth's surface but is home to more than 1% of all known living creatures and more than 2% of all land and freshwater species. With over 22,000 species of animals and plants, it has one of the highest levels of biological diversity in Europe.

The forests around Kočevje are one of the few places where one can see the big three (the bear, the lynx and the wolf) in their natural surroundings.





△MATURE PARKS

For a relatively small area, Slovenia offers a unique mosaic of biological, geographical and cultural diversity, with dozens of major natural assets and items of significant European cultural heritage. The Triglav National Park, three regional parks (Kozjansko, Notranjska and Škocjan Caves) and 45 landscape parks are intended for the protection of heritage and diversified landscape, forests and native plant and animal species.



TRIGLAV NATIONAL PARK

Triglav National Park is the biggest park in Slovenia. It covers 840 square kilometres, or 4% of the country's territory. The country's only national park was named after Slovenia's highest summit, Triglav (2,864 m). Triglav National Park is a place of exploration, education, relaxation and experiencing the great outdoors.


KOZJANSKO REGIONAL PARK

Modelling after the cities of Antiquity, the architect Jože Plečnik created a timeless centre of the capital city and many cultural monuments around Slovenia. This man with a long beard and round glasses who carried a sketch pad in his hands also has left a mark in Austria and the Czech Republic. So, now, Ljubljana and Prague are joint candidates for the humanistic architecture of Jože Plečnik to be added to the UNESCO List of World Heritage.



Plečnik's Slovenia

1. THE THREE BRIDGES (TROMOSTOVJE)

Plečnik's Ljubljana is a unique and comprehensive 20th century work of art. The Three Bridges and their balustraded railings rising above the River Ljubljanica leave a special mark on the city centre.

2. THE NATIONAL AND UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

The building with character; its windows look like waves or open books. Its interior is a temple of knowledge leading visitors up a dark Propylaea-styled staircase to a light reading room.

3. MARKETPLACES

Plečnik gave the people of Ljubljana a masterfully designed riverside marketplace. The outdoor area with the arcade resembles antique forums, and spiral staircases lead into the interior of the marketplace.

4. KRIŽANKE

The former monastery is now an event venue that was rebuilt by Plečnik with a string of courtyards for the Ljubljana Festival, one of the oldest European summer festivals.

5. THE ŽALE MEMORIAL COMPLEX

Plečnik focused a lot on the sacred and on spirituality. The Žale Central Cemetery is known for its memorial complex with a monumental entrance and many chapels of different shapes.

1. PARISH CHURCH OF THE ASCENSION, BOGOJINA

From afar, the steeple on the edge of the Pannonian Plains resembles a lighthouse. Its architecture combines classical ideals of Antiquity and local tradition, which is also evident from the integration of the old and the new church.

2. CHURCH OF ST. MICHAEL, ČRNA VAS

The exterior almost gives the impression of an elevated antique temple. Some of the interesting details of the wood furnished interior include coffee grinders and other recycled items.

3. STEPS BY THE ROSARY CHURCH AND THE FAÇADE OF PREŠEREN THEATRE, KRANJ

Architectural harmony in the old heart of Kranj. These romantic steps lead to a fountain, from where only a short stroll takes you to the arcades marking the entrance to the theatre.

4. CHURCH OF ST. BENEDICT, STRANJE

Plečnik created some hidden beauties in Kamnik and its surroundings, including the interior of a church in a panoramic location, which is full of distinct details, from chandeliers to wooden pillars and a ceiling

5. PEOPLE'S SAVINGS BANK, CELJE


The undergraduate project of Plečnik's students lends the town centre of Celje some elegance. It is impossible to miss the architect's signature building with balconies with columns.





UNESCO SITES OF NATURAL, CULTURAL AND INTANGIBLE HERITAGE

There are 4 cultural and natural sights in Slovenia that are on the UNESCO List of World Natural and Cultural Heritage and 4 sights on the UNESCO Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity. The architecture of Jože Plečnik, the conventional Karst with more than 11,000 subterranean caves, where the science of karstology began developing and spreading worldwide, and the Walk of Peace with World War I heritage are all candidates for inclusion among the world's heritage elite. Slovenia has two geoparks in the UNESCO network – the Karavanke Alps with the Peca underground and Idrija with its geological fault. The UNESCO biosphere reserves include the Julian Alps and its highest peak and the symbol of Slovenia, Mt Triglav, the Karst, the Mura River and Kozjansko & Obsotelje regions. The capital, Ljubljana, is a UNESCO City of Literature.

The broad sky and the mysteries of underground caves offer even more opportunities for adventurous activities.

HIKING

Although Slovenia only covers an area of around 20,000 km^2 and can be traversed diagonally by motorway in less than three hours, it is criss-crossed by almost 10,000 kilometres of marked paths. Exploring areas that can be covered by car in a matter of minutes can take hours and hours on foot. And the more you stray from main routes, the more you realise that walking is the right way to discover the true beauties of Slovenia. Fifty-two hikers' hotels located along footpaths offer specialised accommodation. You can also sleep in climbers' huts, either in the mountains or in lower-lying areas. Huts in high mountain areas are open in summer, while in other areas they are open all year round (at weekends).

Slovenia is crossed by hiking trails in all directions. If you want to experience the genuine Slovenian countryside, set off on one of the established routes. The Slovenian section of the E6 European Hiking Trail – the Cigler Trail – runs from the Drava to the Adriatic, while the Slovenian section of the E7 European Hiking Trail – the Mara Rupena Trail – runs from Dolenjske Toplice to Žužemberk. The Via Alpina, 5,000 kilometres long and divided into 341 one-day stages, runs through eight Alpine countries.

The Julian Alps hiking trail takes you to the sanctuary of the Julian Alps, to Triglav National Park, Lake Bohinj and the idyllic Lake Bled, the emerald-green beauty of the Soča River and all the way to the vineyard hills of Brda.

There are over 380 themed tourist trails in Slovenia. Most of them are located within individual tourist destinations or municipalities and lead past various sites of cultural or historical interest. By following these trails you can hear stories of the First World War, discover archaeological remains, protected areas and forest paths and hear the stories of characters from literature.



BIKING

Slovenia is almost irresistible for cyclists. Over 250 marked cycling routes and Slovenia's varied land-

scape offer opportunities for adventures on two wheels that are anything but ordinary. Cycle through the Karst or along panoramic routes to wonderful Alpine views.

Explore the Slovenian section of the Drava Cycling Route, which runs through 4 countries and has a total length of about 710 km.

You can cycle by lakes or along the coast, among vineyards and through villages. You can even cycle through an abandoned mine in Mežica! As well as road cycling tours through nature parks, spa towns and rural areas, and cycle paths in the outskirts of towns, Slovenia has a growing number of mountain bike trails. Beginners and professionals will be happy to ride on the biking trails in the many bike parks: Kranjska Gora, Krvavec, Cerkno, Vogel, Pohorje, Golte, Rogla. The Singletrack park Jamnica



is riddled with exciting singletracks, while the nearby Peca mountain boasts "the longest flow trail in Europe". The Pomurje, Dolenjska and Primorska regions are perfect for family cycling trips. You are also welcome to visit one of the best cycling marathons in the world, the renowned Franja Marathon, which takes place in Ljubljana in June. On the first Saturday of September, you can participate in the Ride to Vršič, where you ride to the highest Slovenian mountain pass. At the Tour of Slovenia, international cycling stars compete each year in stage race cycling events.



SKIING AND WINTER SPORTS

The still-vital tradition of the Bloke skiers reminds us of how skiing has become one of the most popular

sports on the sunny side of the Alps. The story began in the 17th century on the Bloke Plateau, where a unique method of travelling over the snow on skis was developed. Slovenia can boast successful professional skiers who are among the best in the world. Every year Kranjska Gora and Maribor host FIS World Cup competitions.

Pokljuka is famous as the first biathlon Centre. Planica, a ski jumping and flying centre is also a modern Olympic Sports Centre. Boasting an extraordinary winter sports tradition, Slovenia is a great destination for lovers of Alpine and Nordic skiing, ski touring, snowboarding, sledding, snowshoeing, and other winter pursuits.

The skiing season in Slovenia runs from December to March. On the highest-lying slopes the season can sometimes extend into May, when the green landscape already promises a different experience. There are over ten ski centres in the section of the Alps that extends into Slovenia. Slovenia is a country of small ski resorts which offer a pleasant and homely atmosphere. The diverse terrain is suitable for beginners and children as well as experienced skiers. Obtain a single Ski Pass ticket with which you can ski at all Slovenian ski resorts. Numerous ski schools and ski instructors, who speak different languages, will make sure that you really enjoy the snow. After skiing, take a walk around town, since most of the ski resorts are close to major towns.



FLY FISHING & FISHING

Over 27,000 kilometres of watercourses, the tranquillity of unspoilt nature and a well-conserved wealth of life in the waters are an invitation to try your hand at fly fishing. Slovenia's streams, rivers, ponds and lakes are a magnet for demanding anglers, for whom fly fishing on the emerald-green Soča is without a doubt a treat to be relished. It is a real privilege to be able to fish in this blue-green Alpine beauty, and in order to conserve the environment and the diversity of aquatic life, we must be sure to observe the limits of the fishing season!







MOUNTAIN CLIMBING

The more difficult trails and rock faces in the high mountains of Slovenia create countless natural climbing areas. You can combine climbing with other holiday activities, but climbing conditions in Slovenia are good enough for a climbing adventure of several weeks. It goes without saying that on mountain paths suitable footwear and clothing are an essential condition of safety and enjoyment. The area around Bled and Bohinj, which is also an ideal area for outdoor recreation in the heart of the Alps, offers everything that a mountain climber could desire. The rock formations of the Karst and the coastal area hide many yet undiscovered climbing locations. Beginners can get their first taste of climbing on the artificial climbing wall in Postojna. Recreational climbers can head for the climbing areas in Vipava, Črni Kal and Vipavska Bela, while experienced climbers will enjoy putting themselves to the test below the edge of the Karst, on the 500-metre-wide cliff in Osp, which together with nearby Mišja Peč represents one of the most important climbing areas in Europe. You will also find several climbing areas in the area around Celje.

BIRD WATCHING


Numerous protected areas, well-conserved natural conditions and the efforts of nature protection organisations mean that many birds remain in or return to Slovenia. The Ljubljansko Barje wetlands, Lake Cerknica, the Notranjska Regional Park, the Sečovlje Salina Nature Park and many other areas are true nature reserves where ornithologists and other visitors can even observe the very rarest species.

- prekmurska gibanica, a protected sweet festive cake with layers of apple, cottage cheese, walnut and poppy seed fillings;

- štruklji, dumplings or rolls made of filo pastry or leavened dough, which in Slovenia can be stuffed with over 80 different sweet and savoury fillings;
- Fonda Piran sea bass, a supreme farmed fish, calamari, stuffed or grilled squid, which together with mussels prepared in various local ways prove that Slovenia is also a sea country.

Motorway vignettes

Drivers of motorcycles, passenger vehicles and combined vehicles with permissible maximum weight of 3.5 tons pay toll for driving on motorways and expressways in the Republic of Slovenia with the annual vignette and two short-term vignettes, i.e. monthly and weekly vignette. Half-yearly vignette is only available for one-track vehicles and motorcycles. Vignettes are sold at all petrol stations in Slovenia and its neighboring countries, at branch offices of the national and foreign motoring associations, at post offices and in some kiosks.

Visiting Slovenia does not require long and complicated organisation. The well-organised system of routes to Slovenia and inside the country, the accessibility of a wide range of information on the Internet and the widespread opportunity to communicate in your own language simplify the logistics of a trip.



By car or coach, enter Slovenia from Italy, Austria, Hungary or Croatia. Slovenia is a member of the EU and part of the Schengen Area. The borders with Italy, Austria and Hungary have no border controls and may be crossed anywhere and at any time. At the border with Croatia, border checks are carried out in accordance with Schengen standards, and a simplified procedure is in place for EU citizens.

Service stations

Service stations with petrol pumps are located about every 30 km along motorways and they operate 24 hours a day. There are also plenty of petrol stations in cities and smaller towns. All petrol stations offer unleaded petrol, diesel and at certain stations LPG.

You can rent a car at specialised agencies in towns and at airports. Fleets comprise vehicles of various categories. To rent a car you need to be at least 21 years old and have held a driving licence for at least two years.

BY BUS

You can come to Slovenia by taking a coach from many European cities. Most international coaches make a stop in Ljubljana. Foreign coach transport providers registered in the EU do not require special permits to travel across Slovenia. Check international coach connections with Ljubljana and find information on timetables at www.ap-ljubljana.si/en/international-transfers/.

The green FlixBus coaches connecting Slovenia with other European cities are also increasingly popular.

Bus connections in Slovenia are good. You can take public transport to most of Slovenia's towns and cities and to its countryside. If buses drive on local roads, drivers can make a stop in every town, if you so wish. Bus tickets can be purchased at major bus stations or from the driver.





BY TRAIN

Italy, Austria, Hungary, Serbia, Czechia, Germany, and Switzerland, and indirectly also to other European destinations. You can also come to Slovenia by night trains with sleeping cars. Slovenia is a part of the Eurail Global Pass system, which means that this ticket can also be used to travel to Slovenia. You can take Motorail to go through Slovenia's longest tunnel through Mt Črna Prst leading into Bača Valley, taking you from the Gorenjska region to the Primorska region, more specifically from the Bohinj Valley to the Posočje Valley.

AIR CONNECTIONS

Slovenia has three international airports - Portorož, Maribor and Ljubljana but the great majority of flights use airport Jože Pučnik Ljubljana, which has the advantage of being just 25 kilometres from the capital.

In addition to the daily flights to many European cities, there are three low-cost flight providers flying from the main Slovenian international airport Jože Pučnik Ljubljana. They are EasyJet, Transavia and Wizz Air, flying to London, Berlin, Brussels and Amsterdam. Adria Airways is the only Slovenian air carrier and it operates most of the flights to Ljubljana; however, you can also fly other air carriers, such as Turkish Airlines, Air-Serbia, AirFrance, LOT, Finnair and Montenegro Airlines. You can also fly to one of the foreign airports in the near vicinity, and access Slovenia from there by bus, train or rental car.



CRUISING CENTRE

Koper is not only a strategically important seaport, but an excel-



MARITIME TRAVEL

On the Slovenian Adriatic coast there are modern marinas in Porto-

rož, Koper and Izola and there is also a special Yacht Centre for technical services in Izola available to nautical tourists. All marinas provide fuel, which is also available at the public piers. Piran Bay attracts lovers of sailing. Rental of sailing boats is available, but you will need a valid skipper's licence or other qualification to operate it. Alternatively, an experienced skipper may be hired together with a sailing boat.
